


BYE-LAWS OF THE ROUND TOWER G.A.A. CLUB



CLUB COLOURS

1. The official Club colours will consist of a Green and White Hooped Jersey with 4" Bands, together with White Shorts and Green and White Stockings.

GAMES SUBCOMMITTEES

2. All playing activities in the Club shall be managed by Sub Committees.

In the event of adult and juvenile Sub-Committees for a code the juvenile shall look after and include U.16

3. All mentors of the various teams shall be appointed by the Sub-Committees. They shall also have the power to remove any mentor who in their opinion is not acting in the interest of the Club or Team under his/her control. Mentors so removed shall be entitled to appeal to the Executive Committee.
4. All Sub-Committees shall ensure that before the commencement of competitions, all teams are properly equipped with jerseys, balls, hurleys, list books etc. and the team mentors shall be held responsible for the safe keeping of this equipment. Mentors shall immediately report the loss of any item of equipment to their relative Sub- Committee.
5. The adult Hurling and Football games committees shall allocate which pitches the various teams shall play on at any given time and the team mentors shall adhere strictly to this. In the event of any disagreement, the Executive will be the final arbiter.

MENTORS

6. No team mentor or mentors shall enter into any sponsorship deal without first obtaining the approval of the Executive Committee.
7. Team mentors shall be responsible for the collection of subscriptions from the players under their control and having deducted necessary expenses, submit them to their respective games committee, who in turn shall pass them on to the Club Treasurer, with an itemized account.
8. All mentors of teams shall be paid up members.

TEAMS AND PLAYERS

9. Individual teams who organise fund raising events for their own needs, having first received the approval of the Executive Committee shall submit all proceeds to the Hon. Treasurer together with an itemized account.
10. All Juvenile players must play and train with the team at the youngest age level for which they are qualified. This applies to both Hurling and Football, from Under Eight Grade to Minor. Any juvenile player who fails to satisfy this requirement is not eligible for selection to play or train with a team at a higher age grade. Juvenile players who satisfy this requirement are eligible to play and train at higher grades subject to current GAA regulations on juvenile participation.

11. On completion of the nursery Girls and Boys will be split into their own teams by gender from U8s onwards. Only when a games programme is not available to the player in question, should an underage girl be considered for selection in a boys code.

GROUNDS

12. When South Dublin Co. Council declares its pitches unplayable, the pitches in Moyle Park College shall also be deemed unplayable.
13. All members of the games and grounds committees must be fully paid up members.
14. Chairpersons of the subcommittees shall continue to hold office until reappointed or replaced by the new Executive Committee elected at the AGM.

SOCIAL

15. A social committee shall be formed who shall organize the social activities in the Clubrooms and the Annual Dinner Dance. They shall be responsible for any money collected at Socials etc. and submit on a regular basis to the Club Treasurer an itemized account together with any surplus money collected.
16. Facilities in the Clubrooms shall only be availed of by paid up members and their guests.

A.G.M.

17. Where a member has been nominated for a position on the Executive Committee, but who due to illness, work reasons or any other genuine reason is unable to attend the A.G.M. such a member shall be allowed stand for the position nominated provided he/she submits in writing the reason for not being able to attend.
18. At Annual General Meetings, a member - who is nominated for a position on the Executive Committee and who makes any statement or speech for election purposes, may be deemed out of order by the chairman of the meeting.

MEMBERSHIP AND VISITORS

19. Senior citizens shall apply for membership in the normal way, but the Executive Committee shall have power to reduce or waive the fee payable.
20. A register shall be kept of visitors to the club. After a specified number of visits they shall be notified they had reached the limit of visits allowed and be invited to apply for membership.
21. The legal requirements covering visitors shall be strictly enforced.

ALL TICKET MATCHES

22. Only paid up members shall be entitled to apply for tickets. The number of tickets per member to be limited at the discretion of the Executive Committee. All tickets must be paid for prior to issue.

DISCIPLINE

23. Members are expected to show courtesy at all times to fellow members, visitors and staff -failure to do so can and may result in a member being requested to attend a meeting of the Disciplinary Committee and/or the Executive.

BAR MANAGEMENT

24. Bar Manager is responsible for bar staff and clubhouse. The Manager, in turn, is accountable to the Chairman and Treasurer. Queries, or complaints, should be brought to the attention of the Executive.
